

This year NorthStar Trail Travelers will be sponsoring eight weekend events throughout 2025 and we hope you'll put the dates on your calendar and plan to join us!

Start out the year with a snowshoe/walk event in February, this year on **Brown's Creek Trail** in Stillwater. This event will be held on **Saturday**, **February 8**. Bring along your snowshoes if you have them, borrow a set from Afton supply, or wear your winter boots to check out the trail in winter!

In May we'll spend the weekend at Myre Big Island State Park near Albert Lea. On May 17-18 we'll do two different one-day events at the park, one on Saturday and one on Sunday. Join us at the state park that held Volkssport events before the DNR or NSTT!

On July 26-27, we'll go up to Moose Lake State Park for a one day event on Saturday, and to Banning State Park on Sunday. We haven't been to either park for many years, so it will be nice to go back and visit these scenic parks. Check out the agate display at Moose Lake and take a walk to Wolf Creek Falls at Banning.

In September we'll head south to Flandrau State Park in New Ulm and Minneopa State Park near Mankato, on September 27-28. We'll be close to a brewery in New Ulm and see (hopefully!) a herd of bison at Minneopa. A hobo soup supper is planned for Saturday night at Minneopa.

Our annual meeting/guided walk will be on Saturday, October 25 where we'll register and start from Fort Snelling State Park with part of the walk going up the bluff to Historic Fort Snelling to see the newly renovated historic area. A second loop will stay in the park. Plan to stay for our potluck lunch and annual meeting, including board elections and door prizes!

Let's make a big attempt to bring new walkers to our fun events in Minnesota's great state parks!

State Park Vehicle Permit

A state park vehicle permit is required when you enter any state park. Daily permits cost \$7. An annual permit can be purchased for \$35 and entitles you to an unlimited number of visits to any and all Minnesota State



Directions: The Gasthaus Bavarian Hunter is located at 8390 Lofton Ave, Stillwater. It is three miles north of Hwy. 36, off Hwy. 15 (Manning Ave.). Turn west on



McKusick Rd. and take the first left to the restaurant.

Distance: The event is sanctioned for 11K (6.2 miles)

made up of a 5k and a 6k loop. Trails are a well-maintained mix of grassland and woodland. Includes Bur Oak and White Fox Trails on one loop and Great Marsh Trail and Prairie View Trail on other loop. Okay for outdoor strollers.


Distance: The event is sanctioned for 10K (6.2 miles) made

Moose Lake State Park Saturday, July 26

Cost: Award, \$9; IVV event book credit, \$4; walk only, \$4. Vehicle permit required, see page 2.




Distance: Sanctioned for

10km, made up of two 5km loops. The trails are either easy and grassy or packed gravel. The Rolling Hills trail is just that and the Echo Lake trail has one steeper hill. Okay for outdoor strollers.

For info: Go to nstt.org or call Ellie, 218-565-0508, or Mary, 218-340-0548. For park info 218-460-7001.

Directions to the park: 4252 County Rd 137, Moose Lake, MN 55767. The park is approximately 120 miles north of the Twin Cities. Take exit 214 on I35W to

MN-73 toward Moose Lake. At stop sign turn right on Co Rd 137. In .4 miles turn right into the park.



Other info: Canoes, kayaks and row boats are available to rent at Moose Lake boat launch and pier. The Agate and Geological Center (in the park) has interesting displays. Munger Trail is nearby.

Camping information: If camping, recommend camping at Moose Lake State Park, sites 12-18e, as the showers will be under construction in Banning.

Banning State Park Sunday, July 27

Distance: Sanctioned for

12km with choice of 6km, 5km or 1km. Trail to Wolf Creek Falls is mowed grass until the last few hundred feet through big rocks. Quarry Loop trail is gravel and grass except for out and back to Blueberry slide, which has steps, rocks and roots. Strollers are okay on all but the last part to the falls and to Blueberry Slide.



Distance: Sanctioned for 10km, 2 5km loops. The Red trail is more challenging with several hills, and a 75-step stairway. This trail follows the Cottonwood River where you will see an area that was washed out by recent high flood waters. Mostly dirt trails with rocks and roots. The Blue trail goes through woods and across a prairie area. Some gentle hills. Dirt and grass covered trails. Strollers can be used on this trail.

Directions to the park: 1300 Summit Ave, New Ulm, MN 56073. 100 miles south of Twin Cities via US 169. The park is located adjacent to and partially within the city of New Ulm, several blocks southwest of State Hwy. 15 and two miles south of



U.S. Hwy. 14. Located in Brown County.

Lodging information: Both parks have campgrounds (electric/non-electric) including camper cabins.

Make reservations through DNR reservation line.

Numerous hotels/motels in both Mankato and New

Ulm, B&Bs, VRBO, and AIRBNB.


Minneopa State Park Sunday, September 28

Registration: Bison Enclosure Picnic Area. Register between 9 a.m. and noon, finish by 3 p.m.

Award: Minneopa waterfalls leather pin.

Cost: Award, \$9; IVV event book credit, \$4; walk only, \$4. Vehicle permit required, see page 2.






bison enclosure is mainly grass and hill up to historic Seppmann Mill. The 5km trail on right side of enclosure goes along Minnesota River, mainly dirt. Option to walk completely around the enclosure for 8km. The Minneopa Creek Confluence with the Minnesota River is a short 1.5km trail that includes an uphill/downhill component.

Note: It is possible to drive through the bison enclosure but you must stay in the car.


Registration: Register at the Thomas C. Savage Visitor Center starting at 9:30 a.m. 10km group will leave at 10 am.; Fort group and Park group will leave at 10:30 a.m. Naturalist group will leave at 11 a.m. 5km groups should register before 10:15 a.m. Watch for further details closer to event.

Award: Whisky, the Army horse, leather pin.

Cost: Award, \$9; IVV event book credit, \$4; walk only, \$4. Vehicle permit required, see page 2.

Distance: Sanctioned for 10km, made up of two 5km loops. One 5km loop up

the steps to Historic Fort Snelling and the Chapel, down the hilly road to the river and to the old landing on the river, back along the Minnesota River to the Visitor Center. The other 5km loop will stay in the park,



5km Historic Fort group — This group will walk just the Historic Fort loop described above, returning to the Visitor Center.

5km Park group — This group will stay in the park, will go to Pike Island and avoid the hardest of the hills/steps.


Naturalist group — This group will walk with Naturalist Kao Thao to the backwater of the Minnesota River, fishing pier and Snelling Lake and back to the Visitor Center.

This is a guided walk and according to AVA policies, ALL walkers must walk in a group with a group leader. No exceptions can be made as walkers on their own could represent a liability to NSTT and AVA if they are injured on the trail.

over to the landing, the first loop on Pike Island and back along the Minnesota River and up the Berglund Trail to the steps and back to Visitor Center. Park naturalist, Kao Thao, will lead a 1 to 1-1/2 mile naturalist walk to the Minnesota River and over to Snelling Lake leaving at 11 a.m., which will not have any hills.
